To the WSRT Board of Directors and the WSRT Membership,

When I was elevated to Chairman in 2016, I never thought my journey on the WSRT Board of Directors would last as long as it has and I certainly never envisioned how close I would become with all the amazing people that work diligently to ensure that the WSRT continues to function. To each of you, kudos! There have been many new faces that have joined the board and the committees over the past few years and this gives me hope that the WSRT will continue to function to serve the radiographers and the public of the state of Wisconsin for many years to come.

I want to thank all of the members of the board and committees that have helped me for my time on the board. Some are new and have brought new life into the meetings, some have left for greener pastures, and, sadly, some are no longer with us. To all of them, I give my most heartfelt thank you! To my mentors, I have no words that could express the gratitude that I have for the knowledge, experience, and time you have shared with me. The one person I have to thank the absolute most is Jolynn Van Ert. She and I have been *shipmates* on this ride for a long time now and without her dedication to the WSRT and the board, we would not be where we are now.

As for the business of the WSRT, to state the obvious, the past two years have been an adventure to say the least. The board faced issues that no other board has had to face and was able to continue to function during the pandemic and the stay-at-home orders instituted on the state level. Prior to the pandemic, the board, along with its in-person meetings during the year, was meeting through telephone conferences multiple times during the year but with the pandemic changing how many people worked, we were able to begin holding virtual meetings on digital platforms that allowed us to see each other as well as talk to one another. This allowed the board to record the meetings so that board members that are unable to attend could review the meetings at a later date.

The Board was also planning to combine with the students and educators in the spring of 2020 for a combined conference at the Kalahari Resort in the Wisconsin Dells. This combined conference would reduce the cost of holding one conference for the students and educators and one for the WSRT which were held at different times and different locations. Several board members along with the leadership of the educator group, WAERT - the Wisconsin Association of Educators in

Radiologic Technology, worked together with the Kalahari to create a platform for the two groups to once again hold a combined conference. Sadly, due to the restrictions that so many were under, the conference had to be cancelled. The plan was put on hold with the intent to hold the combined meeting in 2021.

Sadly, the 2021 plan for the combined conference had to once again be put on hold. With so many members of the board and the educational programs on travel restrictions, the potential number of students, educators, and technologists that would be able to attend an in-person conference did not warrant the board and the educators holding an in-person conference. The Board decided to explore the possibility of holding a virtual conference. After researching different venues, MTMI, Medical Technology Management Institute, of Wauwatosa offered their platform free of charge to the WSRT. The board then began to make plans for speakers and worked in conjunction with WAERT to create a 3-day program for students, educators, and technologists that includes 21 CE credits and CQR credits for technologists. It gives the educators a chance to hold lectures for the students along with resuming the Quiz Bowl and the Essay and Exhibit Competitions. The conference also gives the Board the opportunity to hold business meetings. This meeting is a step in the right direction to attract a different generation of technologists to the annual conference and to move the Board of Directors forward with fresh people and ideas. If you have not had the chance or were unaware, the student exhibits and presentations are available on the WSRT website, wsrt.net, under the student section.

The past eight years have been an amazing journey that I would never trade. Please take time to consider if you have something to contribute and offer to serve. The WSRT is made up of amazing volunteers and are always looking for new people to help and serve. If serving is not “your thing” then join the WSRT and be an advocate for the field. The more voices that speak out for our field will help ensure that we are promoting the best practices by the experts, us, in our field.

To the WSRT Board of Directors and the WSRT Membership,

It has been a privilege and honor to have served the membership this past year as the President of the Wisconsin Society of Radiologic Technologists. 2020 proved to be a very difficult year as we faced the invisible threat of a novel virus; it felt like our world stopped in an instant and we found ourselves collectively holding our breath. The 'unknowns' greatly outweighed the 'knowns' which significantly influenced a myriad of subsequent activities.

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, the WAERT/WSRT made the difficult decision to cancel the WAERT/WSRT Educational Symposium scheduled for April 23-25, 2020. The WSRT was also slated to host its Annual Conference during that time frame. The Symposium was designed to be a multi-day educational event; keeping the current structure of the WAERT Student Symposium but expanding its CEU offerings to additionally meet practicing technologist's needs.

The 2020 ASRT Governance and House of Delegates meeting was initially scheduled for June 25-28, 2020 in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Again, in response to Covid-19, the ASRT made the tough decision to cancel the in-person event and instead held a Virtual Special Meeting of the House of Delegates on June 27, 2020. Wisconsin was represented by the WSRT Member Delegate Mary Gehin and me, Jolynn Van Ert, President. Earlier in the year, the WSRT Board of Directors selected two student representatives to participate in the ASRT Student Leadership Development Program. Alexa Peterson was selected from the Radiation Therapy discipline and Zach Ten Pas from the Radiography discipline. Due to the nature of the Virtual Special Meeting of the House of Delegates, the two Wisconsin SLDP students have been extended and are invited to attend the 2021 event.

As an organization, the WSRT is fully committed to providing both education and professional development opportunities for radiologic technologists. This is especially important and relevant as the CQR process is now in force for technologists who have earned any ARRT credential after January 1, 2011. We know uncertainty remains as we confront our 'new normal'. Legislative Committee Report
Annual Conference, April 2021

To the WSRT Board of Directors and the WSRT Membership,

The WSRT legislative committee has been active over the past year monitoring the regulatory activities of the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DPS) and the Wisconsin state legislature. The world pandemic took center stage resulted in cancellations and deferrals of initiatives as state agencies prioritized its response to Covid-19. Virtual methods of working with representatives of all licensed occupations were developed. The Radiography Examining Board (REB) has successfully adapted to meeting via teleconference as has the Wisconsin Society of Radiologic Technologists board and committee members to conduct the business of our profession.

The shift of state agency activities to public health concerns related to the virus highlighted the previously known fact that the state of Wisconsin has not been processing license applications for radiologic technologists and most all professions on a timely basis. Once the November elections were over and the legislature began its 2022 session, a series of draft bills were circulated for cosponsors to address the delays through various angles. As of 4/6/21 to our knowledge, they have not yet been introduced as official legislation:

LRB-0358 and LRB-1176 – PASSIVE REVIEW OF PROFESSIONAL LICENSES 3/9/2021

- Allow individual credentialing boards to delegate the ability to DPS to make determinations about whether or not an applicant should be licensed
- Sets up a two-pronged approach to license approval
- DPS could directly inform individuals if their credential is granted (if given the authority by the relevant examining board); or
- DPS, after conducting the current law required background checks, etc., can forward their recommendation about whether or not the person should be licensed to the relevant examining board. If the Board takes no action on the licensure application within 10 days, the license is automatically approved.

LRB-0357 and LRB-2442– PROVISIONAL LICENSURE 3/9/2021

- Requires DPS to draft rules to set up a process for creating a "provisional license" for people who have applied for a license but are waiting for final approval.
- Individual credentialing boards could set up their own rule related to provisional licenses that would supersede DPS's rules.

- A provisional credential would give someone the same rights, privileges, and authority as a standard credential.
- A credential with provisional status will be granted subject to the ultimate determination on the application for the initial credential or reciprocal credential, and the provisional status will be removed if the application is approved. A credential with provisional status will immediately expire upon the issuance of a notice to deny.

LRB 1044/1, Reciprocal credentials for workforce growth 3/18/2021

Shortages of licensed professionals in a number of critical fields have become increasingly acute in recent years. To help fill those gaps, we will be introducing legislation to establish reciprocal licensing in Wisconsin similar to what has already been implemented successfully in Arizona, and what was recently signed into law in Wisconsin for active duty military spouses and veterans and their spouses (2019 Wisconsin Act 143). Under this bill, licensing boards will recognize out-of-state occupational licenses for people who:

- Have been licensed in their profession for at least one year
- Are in good standing in all states where they are licensed
- Do not have any past or pending investigations, complaints, or license revocations
- Establish residency in Wisconsin
- Pay applicable fees (waived for the next 12 months to deal with the current health crisis)
- Meet all testing and background check requirements per law

These three draft bills do not seem, at this time, to pose a direct threat to the licensure law that protects our patients with the provision of radiologic care by credentialed individuals. However bills can and will change as they are vetted and hearings are held. Years ago, the Radiography Examining Board was slated to be dissolved by a cryptic provision in a state budget initiative, along with other occupational boards. Swift and strong advocacy prevented this from happening, but not without the guidance and work of our Madison policy advisor Mr. Blumenfeld. We are all too aware that forces opposing sensible health regulation will always need to be watched. Surveillance of this kind does not come without cost. The WSRT Board appealed to Mr. Blumenfeld and Associates, to continue to work with the WSRT on the limited basis that the WSRT was able to afford. If there is any reason that WSRT membership is important, it is to support the surveillance that our policy advisors perform. No technologist I know could possibly keep track on a daily basis of government initiatives that could affect us drastically. This vigilance over state developments is necessary to maintain the integrity of the radiologic professions' unique function in health care so that our role is not relegated to nurses and other ancillary staff ready to take on our duties. Your WSRT membership helps to support the important function of advocacy that makes our voices heard in state government.

As chairperson of the legislative committee, I have participated and testified on matters in the activities of the Radiation Safety Advisory Committee, and the meetings of the Radiography Examining Board. It is gratifying to see that licensure, which grants professional status to radiologic technologists, gives us a "seat at the table" in the functions and decisions of state agencies and the direction of radiologic health care. I urge all radiologic technologists of Wisconsin to become advocates, whether it be within the walls of our workplaces or in our community, AND by being a WSRT member. Thank you for allowing me to serve our state society over this past, unprecedented year.


To the WSRT Board of Directors and the WSRT Membership,

The WSRT Board voted to move the WSRT Annual Conference from the fall to take place in tandem with the WAERT Student Symposium scheduled for April 23-25, 2020 at the Kalahari Resort and Convention Center, Wisconsin Dells. This collaboration created a multi-day educational event. The new venture design retained the structure of the WAERT Student Symposium but expanded the CE offerings and marketing to additionally meet practicing technologist's needs. This is especially important and relevant as the CQR process is now in force for technologists who have earned any ARRT credential after January 1, 2011. Unfortunately, due to the Covid-19 pandemic the 2020 event resulted in cancellation.

After the difficult decision to cancel the 2020 Annual Conference, a steering committee was formed to investigate the creation of a VIRTUAL Educational Symposium offering. The WSRT voted in favor to proceed with the 2021 Virtual WAERT/WSRT Educational Symposium, April 18-20, 2021.

- Speakers have been confirmed. 21 CE credits offered during the 3-day event.
- 21 CE credits approved by ASRT and can be used toward ARRT CQR structured education.
- Conference registration fee structure updated for 2021 program.
 - Educators and Technologists = \$30 per day
 - Educators and Technologists = \$75 for all 3-days
 - Students = \$20 for all 3-days
- Virtual event powered by Medical Technology Management Institute (MTMI).
- Christina Smith worked to get the event and agenda built into the WSRT website.
- Miranda Hurley has been actively posting event information and notifications to the WSRT website.
- Rachael Julson actively shared the event on Social Media.
- I submitted the request for an ASRT email blast to advertise the event to WI members.

- I submitted a request to have the event shared on the Minnesota affiliate website.
- Dan Vander Meulen submitted the request to share the event via ASRT communities.
- Christina Smith provided frequent communications regarding attendee numbers.
- Christina Smith collected and submitted the required speaker paperwork necessary for ASRT RFA approval.
- Denise Lukasik-Sedmak provided her expertise in the application for ARRT CQR.
- Ali Liezert-Dale collected speaker biographies.
