

Announcement Public Hearing

The Assembly Committee on Regulatory Licensing Reform is holding a [public hearing](#) on April 27 at 10 a.m. on one of the bills that aims to streamline the licensing process in Wisconsin.

[Assembly Bill 218](#) would:

- Allow individual credentialing boards to delegate the ability to DSPS to make determinations about whether or not an applicant should be licensed
- Set up a two-pronged approach to license approval
- 1) DSPS could directly inform individuals if their credential is granted (if given the authority by the relevant examining board); or
- 2) DSPS, after conducting the current law required background checks, etc., can forward their recommendation about whether or not the person should be licensed to the relevant examining board. If the Board takes no action on the licensure application within 10 days, the license is automatically approved.
